



## Pilot Summer 2010 Award Cycle Fact Sheet

### Eligibility

To be eligible applicants must be majoring in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math (STEM) field. This pilot cycle for summer 2010 is only open to students in the STEM fields who meet the standard eligibility criteria listed below.

- The applicant must be a U.S. Citizen and undergraduate student receiving a Federal Pell Grant at the time of application or during the term of his/her study abroad program.
- The applicant is applying to or has been accepted into a study abroad program eligible for credit by the student's accredited institution of higher education in the U.S.
- The applicant is studying abroad for at least 28 days in one country.
- The applicant is studying abroad in any country except Cuba or a country on the U.S. Department of State's current Travel Warning list.

\*Applicants are not required to study a STEM subject while abroad to be eligible for the scholarship.

### Application Deadlines

Applications for the Summer 2010 awards will be available during both the Fall and Spring application cycles. Students are strongly encouraged to submit their applications during the first application cycle (by the October 6, 2009 deadline) to ensure timely notification of award. Applicants who miss the October 6, 2009 deadline can apply during the second award cycle, but will not be notified of their award status until the first week of May. ### Award Details

125 scholarships will be awarded to students studying abroad during the Summer of 2010. These awards will be up to \$5,000 with an average award of \$3,000.
