

THE INSTITUTE OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION (IIE) NAMES OVER 1,000 TO RECEIVE THE BENJAMIN A. GILMAN INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDY ABROAD

Houston, Texas, November 29, 2012 -- (student's name), who is currently a student at (student's college and major) is one of over 1,000 outstanding American undergraduate students from almost 400 colleges and universities across the U.S. who was offered the prestigious Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship to participate in a study abroad program during the spring term. Gilman Scholars receive up to \$5,000 to apply towards their study abroad program costs, and a limited number of Critical Need Language Awards are given each year for a total award of \$8,000. The Gilman Scholarship Program aims to diversify the kinds of students who study abroad and the countries and regions where they go. The program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs and administered by the Institute of International Education (IIE) in Houston, Texas. Applications for Summer 2013 and Fall 2013/Academic Year 2013-2014 study abroad scholarships are due March 5, 2013 and will be available online in January 2013. Students receiving a federal Pell Grant from two- and four-year institutions are encouraged to apply.

Since the establishment of the Gilman International Scholarship Program by the International Academic Opportunity Act of 2000, over 13,000 students nationwide have received this prestigious award. Congressman Gilman, who retired in 2002 after serving in the House of Representatives for 30 years and chairing the House Foreign Relations Committee, commented, "Study abroad is a special experience for every student who participates. Living and learning in a vastly different environment of another nation not only exposes our students to alternate views, but also adds an enriching social and cultural experience. It also provides our students with the opportunity to return home with a deeper understanding of their place in

the world, encouraging them to be a contributor, rather than a spectator in the international community.”

Recipients of the scholarship have the opportunity to gain a better understanding of other cultures, countries, languages, and economies -- making them better prepared to assume leadership roles within government and the private sector. According to IIE President Allan Goodman, “International education is one of the best tools for developing mutual understanding and building connections between people from different countries. It is critical to the success of American diplomacy and business, and the lasting ties that Americans make during their international studies are important to our country in times of conflict as well as times of peace.”
