









## OPEN DOORS FACT SHEET: NEPAL

## INSTITUTE OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION Educational Exchange Data from *Open Doors 2010*

In the 2009/10 academic year, **11,233** students from Nepal were studying in the United States (down 3.0% from the previous year). Nepal is the eleventh leading place of origin for students coming to the United States.

**Academic Level:** The majority of students from Nepal study at the undergraduate level. In 2009/10, their breakdown was as follows:

64.2% undergraduate 25.8% graduate students

0.8% other

9.2% OPT (Optional Practical Training)

**Historical trends:** Prior to 2009/10, the number of students from Nepal increased dramatically over the past decade. In 2008/09 the number of Nepali students in the U.S. increased by 29.6% following increases of 15.2% in 2007/08, 27.9% in 2006/07 and 25% in 2005/06.
