









OPEN DOORS FACT SHEET: TAIWAN

INSTITUTE OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION Educational Exchange Data from *Open Doors 2010*

In the 2009/2010 academic year, **26,685** students from Taiwan were studying in the United States (down 4.9% from the previous year). Taiwan is the fifth leading place of origin for students in the United States.

Academic Level: The majority of Taiwan's students study at the graduate level. In 2009/10, their breakdown was as follows:

24.8% undergraduate 54.8% graduate students

7.1% other

13.4% OPT (Optional Practical Training)

Historical trends: Student numbers from Taiwan have been on the decline in recent years after peaking in 1993/94 with 37,581 students in the United States. Taiwan was the leading sender of students to the U.S. from 1987/88 to 1988/89, when China became the leading sender. The number of students from Taiwan has decreased gradually since, falling by 0.3% in 2007/08 after two years of increases, and by 4.9% in 2009/10.
