



OPEN DOORS FACT SHEET: SAUDI ARABIA

INSTITUTE OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION Educational Exchange Data from *Open Doors 2012*

In the 2011/12 academic year, **34,139** students from Saudi Arabia were studying in the United States (up 50.4% from the previous year). Saudi Arabia jumped two places to become the fourth leading place of origin for students coming to the United States, and is by a wide margin the first among Middle Eastern countries in terms of sending students to the United States.

Academic Level: The majority of Saudi Arabian students study at the undergraduate level. In 2011/12, their breakdown was as follows:

42%	undergraduate
18%	graduate students
38.7%	other
1.3%	OPT (Optional Practical Training)

Historical trends: In the late 1970s, the number of Saudi students in the U.S. increased rapidly, peaking in 1980/81 with 10,440 students. After that, there was a period of fluctuation, until 1993/94, followed by increases until 2001/02. In the 2002/03 academic year, enrollments dropped 25% and continued to decline until 2005/06, when participants in the Saudi Scholarship Program began enrolling on U.S. campuses. In 2005/06, the number of Saudi students in the U.S. rose 14% from the previous year, to a total of 3,448. With the scholarship program in place, the number of students showed a dramatic rise of 129% in 2006/07, when it appeared in the list of top 25 places of origin at #12, and continued to experience double-digit growth in the following four years. With scholarship students in the pipeline for several years, the increase reached 44% in 2010/11. Saudi Arabia has moved up to the fourth leading place of origin, from #6 the previous year and #9 in 2008/09.
