The Scholar-Leaders will receive 1,150 USD annually for the remainder of their studies up to a maximum of three (3) years, assuming continued satisfactory academic performance.

The program includes a three-day Leadership Development Seminar, a mentoring component, and a community service requirement. The Leadership Development Seminar which will be held in Hanoi from July 16-18, 2012, aims to provide the award winning students with an opportunity to enhance their personal skills as well as to share ideas and develop networks. The seminar includes workshop sessions that



focus on self awareness, developing leadership skills, and critical thinking skills as well as team-building exercises. In addition, our guest speakers will share with the students their points of view on human relations and how to succeed in the world.

The Scholar-Leaders Program is funded by the GE Foundation ([www.gefoundation.com](http://www.gefoundation.com)), the philanthropic organization of the General Electric Company ([www.ge.com](http://www.ge.com)). These scholarships represent an investment in initiatives that improve educational opportunity and strengthen community organizations in GE communities in Vietnam and around the world.
