Visiting Fulbright Scholar Programs

The Visiting Fulbright Scholar Program can help colleges and universities internationalize their campuses by bringing scholars and professionals from abroad to the United States. Sponsored by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, the following programs (each with its own eligibility and application requirements) are available in 2012:

- **Fulbright Occasional Lecture Fund (OLF):** This travel fund provides Fulbright Visiting Scholars currently in the United States to accept guest lecturing invitations from other colleges and universities. More information is posted at <http://www.cies.org/olf/>
- **Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program:** This Fulbright program provides mid-career professionals from abroad with funds to spend 10 months in the U.S. to pursue non-degree academic study and professional experiences related to leadership and public service.
