Supporting Refugee and Displaced Students: Obtaining admission and attending university is nearly impossible for displaced and refugee students. **IIE's Odyssey Scholarship** supports these individuals throughout the application, admission, and academic degree programs so they can persevere despite all odds.

Empowering Threated Artists: Artists are often the first to be repressed, often violently so. **IIE's Artist Protection Fund** is the only global program that provides artists and writers with fellowship funding, placement, mentoring, and inclusion in a comprehensive network of artistic and social support.

Providing Aid to Students in Need: Natural disasters, global pandemics, civil wars, or political and economic collapse can have devastating effects on students' abilities to complete their education.

IIE's Emergency Student Fund provides urgent financial assistance to help international students in crisis so they can remain in school and make progress toward their academic degree.
